However, the scheme of Mahila Samridhy Yojana (MSY), launched by NMDFC, is aimed at empowering women belonging to Minorities. The scheme is being implemented by NMDFC through the SCAs as well as NGOs.

Under the scheme, the women are provided skill training and micro credit is extended to them subsequently. In addition to the above, 90% of the beneficiaries covered under the NMDFC micro financing scheme & 35% under NMDFC Term Loan Scheme are Minority women.

The Government of Andhra Pradesh has stopped the implementation of NMDFC schemes in Andhra Pradesh. The SCA of NMDFC in Andhra Pradesh is Andhra Pradesh State Minorities Finance Corporation.

The Term Loans are provided by NMDFC through the SCAs nominated by the respective State Governments. The Micro Credit is provided by NMDFC to the members of Self Help Groups (SHGs) which predominantly comprise of minority women, through Non Governmental Organizations (NGOs) as well as the SCAs.
