informed him about concessional Education Loan of NMDFC. This gave a ray of hope and Nida approached JKWDC as SCA of NMDFC and was able to secure loan of required amount in July 2019 for studying at California, USA. Ms. Nida and her family are grateful to NMDFC and Govt. of India for extending timely concessional credit, which has helped to realize her dream to pursue a US Degree and become economically independent to support her family.

Sujeena Sajeev | Term Loan

Ms. Sujeena Sajeev, from Eluva town, in Ernakulum Distt. faced challenges due to dwindling income from construction business of her husband, especially during Covid-19 lockdown. She urgently needed loan to tide over this financial crisis, for setting up of her own business. She came to know about NMDFC loans available through Kerala State Backward Classes Development Corporation Ltd (KSBCDC). She applied for loan which was released to her by KSBCDC.

She has setup a fancy Store cum Stationary Shop, in Komabar Jn. with the help of NMDFC Term Loan of Rs. 5.0 Lakhs, in January, 2021. Her shop is registering brisk business with monthly profit of Rs 65000/-. She has also provided employment to 3 persons in her shop. She salutes Govt. of India for such meaningful self-employment scheme implemented through NMDFC which has led her from financial hardship to respectable situation, now.

A skill training Programme in the trade of "Pre Assembly Operator" under Kausal Se Kushalta Scheme of NMDFC was organized in the Walajabad Dist. of Tamil Nadu through Tamil Nadu Minorities Economic Development Corporation Ltd. (TAMCO) and Central Footwear Training Institute. 20 women from the nearby villages participated in the training programme held from 30.09.2019 to 28.11.2019. During this training they have acquired the skill of splitting, gimping, ironing, marking, edge coloring, pasting, folding and eyeleting and understood the importance of the quality within the footwear manufacturing processes.

After successful training, all 20 trainees have also passed the assessment test and were placed in wage employment in the KM ENTERPRISES, No. 366, Poadgai Nagar, TNHB Back Side, Walajah, Vellore, Tamil Nadu at the monthly average salary of Rs. 8000/- per month.

The training and employment with the financial assistance of NMDFC have provided them social and financial security and also brought a positive change in their life. These women are highly thankful to NMDFC & Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India.

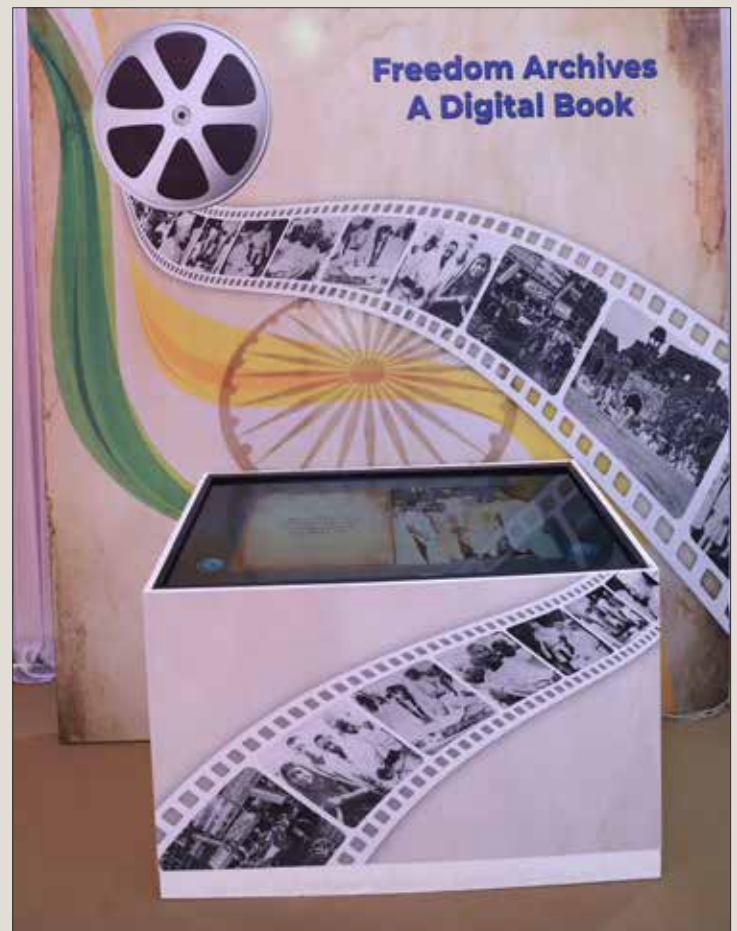
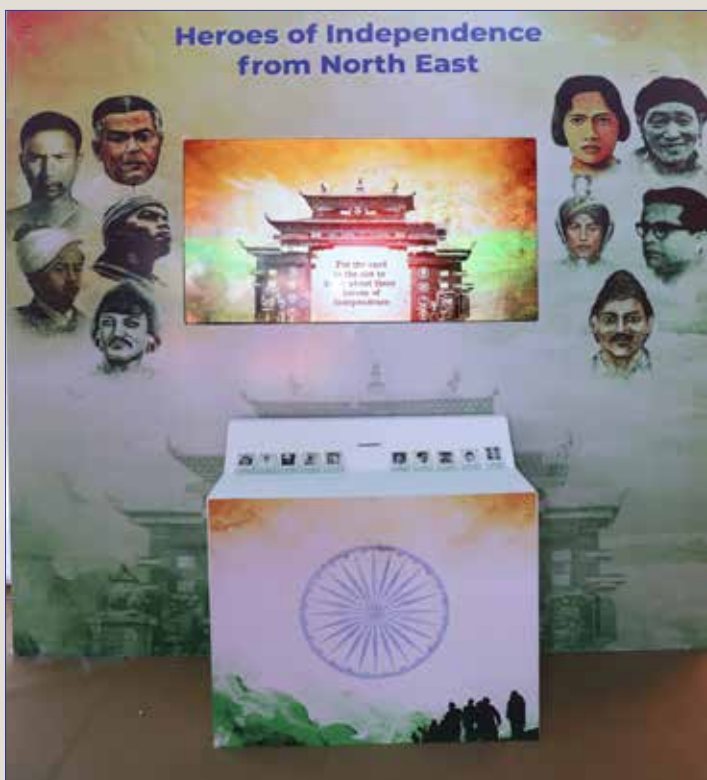

Celebration of AZADI KA AMRIT MAHOTSAV

A Pavilion on "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav" was set up by NMDFC for celebrating 75 years of India's Independence by showcasing Freedom Fighters, Heroes of Independence movement from North East and Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan. It was setup as part of the Hunar Haat under USTTAD scheme of Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India at Guwahati, Assam. The event was organized at Veterinary College Ground, Khanapara, G.S. Road, Guwahati, Assam from 11th to 20th March, 2022. Besides, "A freedom archives - a digital book" was also presented on large touch screen in the pavilion so that visitors of the Hunar Haat can get information about the freedom movement in India. The Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav pavilion in the Hunar Haat was highly appreciated and was successful in creating awareness on significance of freedom movement amongst lakhs of visitors.



Year 2021-2022 has been the most successful year in NMDFC's history of 27 years. This year highest ever number of 1,60,292 persons from minority community were benefited under different schemes, by extending Credit of over Rs. 700.00 Crores.

Since inception NMDFC has disbursed credit worth Rs. 7132.25 Crs. and covered nearly 20 lakh families. This is more than three times the paid up capital of NMDFC i.e. Rs. 2357.72 Crs. at present. This has been achieved due to good recoveries from SCAs and efficient roll-over of funds by NMDFC.

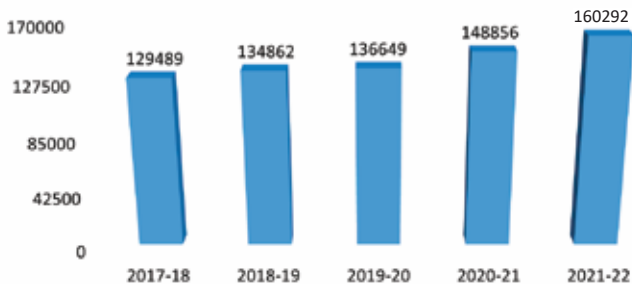
Despite the COVID Pandemic and lockdowns, NMDFC has achieved milestone of highest ever disbursement in F.Y. 2021-22. NMDFC has extended financing in 12 states & 2 UTs through 19 SCAs during the F.Y. 2021-22.

In a unique initiative, NMDFC has tied up with Canara Bank and released Rs. 15.00 Crs. during F.Y. 2021-22, in 16 States/UTs during F.Y. 2021-22 which includes States of Arunachal Pradesh, Lakshadweep, Meghalaya & Telangana where loaning for the first time has been done under NMDFC schemes. Further loaning has also been undertaken in the States of Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Karnataka, Punjab, Orissa, Madhya Pradesh and Manipur through Canara bank after a gap of several years.

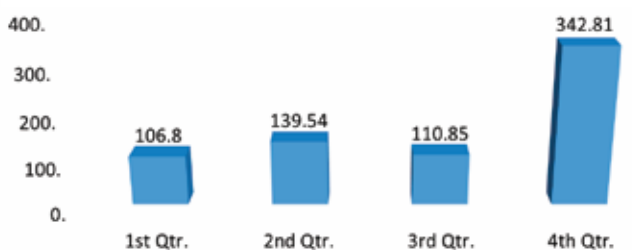


ACHIEVEMENTS DURING LAST 5 YEARS (2017 - 2022)

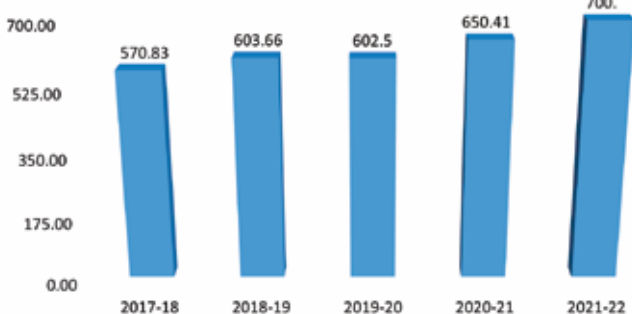
No. of beneficiaries covered during the last 5 years
